

Innate immune responses in cardiovascular injury

is Associate Professor Christian Schulz of Cardiovascular Immunology and Head of Experimental Cardiology at the Ludwig Maximilian University Munich. He graduated from Goethe University in Frankfurt, where he obtained his MD in the Department of Cardiovascular Physiology. He undertook his specialist training in Internal Medicine at the Technical University in Munich. Thereafter he worked as Postdoctoral Fellow and Senior Lecturer at the Department of Immunology at King's College London, UK. He teaches in Medicine and Immunology, and is coordinator of a Clinician Scientist Program to integrate translational research and patient care. His research interest is the body's response to sterile inflammation and how innate immunity shapes cardiovascular diseases. He studies the properties of immune cells in mice and men, aiming to provide a detailed understanding of their regulation, which may lead novel interventions in inflammatory diseases.
